(Ticket #62180)

Units: 3, Transfer to both UC and CSU

Comprehensively examines the historical development, philosophy, and theoretical aspects of the three components of the American criminal justice system, the police, courts, and corrections.

BIO 1 – The Life Sciences

(Ticket #60945)

Units: 3, Transfer to both UC and CSU

An introductory integrated survey of the major principles of biology. General topics include molecular and cell biology, physiology, genetics, ecology/environmental science, and evolution.

May be taken with or without BIO 1L. Credit in either BIO 1 or 1H, but not both.

BIO 1L – The Life Sciences Laboratory (Ticket #60995)

Unit: 1, Transfer to both UC and CSU

Topics include the application of laboratory equipment and procedures to the investigation of biological systems from the biochemical, cellular, organismal, ecological, and evolutionary perspective.

Recommended laboratory course to accompany BIO 1 or BIO 1H lecture and may be taken independently or concurrently with the lecture, but not prior to either.

CIM 117 – Social Media Marketing

(Ticket #62185A)

Units: 3, Transfer to CSU only

Introduces social media tools including uses, ethics, and guidelines for social networking and online marketing channels. Students create a social media marketing campaign through the use of Web applications, such as Facebook, LinkedIn, and Twitter.

Also listed as ENTR 117: credit in either area, not both.

MGT 1 – Introduction to Business

Units: 3, Transfer to both UC and CSU

A survey in business providing a multidisciplinary examination of how culture, society, economic systems, legal, international, political, financial institutions, and human behavior interact to affect a business organization's policy and practices within the U.S. and a global society.

PSYC 1 – Introduction to Psychology (Ticket #60685)

Units: 3, Transfer to both UC and CSU

An introduction to the major concepts, theoretical perspectives, empirical findings, and historical trends in psychology.
