



DRIVER'S EDUCATION

IRVINE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

Irvine Unified is pleased to offer Driver's Education for the 2017-18 school year. This course will be a blended learning format, with both online course requirements and weekly after school in-person meetings at a designated location.

Course Description

The Driver's Education course is designed to teach students the concepts and laws related to driving a vehicle. Topics include the responsibilities of driving, rules of the road, traffic procedures, safe driving concepts, the legal obligations of driving, alcohol and drug use as related to driving, and distracted driving.

The course is 2.5 elective credits, pass/fail only, and meets the DMV minimum requirement of 30 hours of classroom instruction to obtain a learner's permit. This course is the classroom portion only and does not include the 'behind the wheel' portion. An orientation for parents and students will be held before each session.

Age requirements:

Students must be 15 years old before the start of the course. Students must be at least 15 1/2 years old to take the permit test and apply for the learner's permit through the Department of Motor Vehicles. It is recommended that students take the course as close as possible to the intended permit test date.
