How to apply: You call the test site you prefer and sign up for a test date NOTE: Sign up before May; you may not get a test date after that. Courses cleared : Up to 20 credits of English; up to 10 credits of Math; up to 10 credits of Science. The rest go to elective credits for the Adult Diploma* (see *Note)	Credits cleared: 30 elective credits for regular Creekside diploma
Pass/No Pass? No. You may retake (up to 3 times) the parts of the test you did not pass until you have completed it successfully.	Pass/No Pass? Yes. Your test results will be provided as either "Pass" or "No Pass." Note: If you pass one part of this test, your results will be saved, and you may retake only the part you failed. The next test will be in July,and you will pay another

***NOTE:** The Irvine Adult Diploma is a fully acceptable diploma given by Irvine Adult school to graduating seniors who are 18 years old or over. It requires only 195 credits and is the diploma you will receive if you use the GED.

The California High School Proficiency Exam gives 30 <u>elective credits</u> toward the regular Creekside High School Diploma of 215 credits.
